KCL OPPOSES MOTORIZED TRAILS ON TENDERFOOT

The National Forest Service began a scoping project for the purpose of creating over 30 miles of motorized trails on Tenderfoot mountain. The KCL opposes this action as it conflicts with the current Snake River Master Plan and the recently released Travel Management Plan (which was 10 years in the making). We understand that some of our friends and members are dirt-bike and ATV enthusiasts. Our opposition to this proposed project is not meant to disenfranchise any of you but rather benefit many of our communities stakeholders. Keep in mind that this is just an early stage, first step. CDOT OPEN MEETING

Colorado Department of Transportation is currently reviewing all hazardous material routing within the State of Colorado and will be hosting an open meeting on December 8th from 1-3 p.m. at the **North Branch** of the [Silverthorne Library](#). One Hazmat route which is being considered is Loveland Pass. Before the Eisenhower and Johnson Tunnels were constructed, U.S. Highway 6/Loveland Pass was considered one of the most dangerous roads in the United States. The Loveland Pass Hazmat route is being re-evaluated with CDOT. We encourage all who can attend this meeting to please do so.
